FIRST YEAR SURVEY 2011 SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

- Nearly three-quarters of first-year students visited the Truman campus at least once as part of the admission process.
- Approximately one quarter of first year students said the liberal arts mission of the University was influential in their decision to attend.
- One-half of respondents reported that Truman's academic reputation was the most important reason for attending while one-third listed the cost of attendance or financial aid as most important.
- Approximately 20% indicated that they are first generation students while 50% indicated that both of their parents had graduated from college.
- 50% identified themselves as middle class while 30% identified themselves as lower class.
- Nearly 75% reported that summer orientation better prepared them to be Truman students.
- Nearly 70% reported that their future happiness depends on the outcome of the next 4 years.
- Over 85% expect to graduate from Truman knowing three or more faculty well enough to ask for a letter of recommendation.
- Over 85% expect most of their first semester grades to be B+ or higher.
- More than a quarter expect to spend less than 10 hours a week preparing for class.





- Nearly 75% reported that their future happiness depends on the outcome of the next 4 years.
- Over 80% expect to graduate from Truman knowing three or more faculty well enough to ask for a letter of recommendation.
- Over 80% expect most of their first semester grades to be B+ or higher.
- More than a quarter expect to spend less than 10 hours a week preparing for class.
